
Tenants are sought for usable areas with a total of 480 m² in the tower and 518 m² at the foot of the tower.

Television tower Dresden – landmark on the river Elbe

- At a height of 252 m the Dresden television tower is the highest viewing platform in Saxony and one of the ten largest television towers in Germany.
- Opened in 1969 its special architectural design and its location on the river Elbe have never ceased to fascinate.
- The Federal Government, the Free State of Saxony and the City of Dresden, together with the Deutsche Funkturm, have decided to reopen the tower to the public.
- 25.6 million euros have been made available for this purpose within the framework of the preservation program for listed buildings.
- Comprehensive upgrading measures will be implemented by Deutsche Funkturm at the upper tiers, tower shaft and in the entrance area.

The operator has the unique opportunity to become involved in the entire design process of this exceptional property from the very beginning and to actively design 480 m^2 of space at a height of 137 to 148 m and 518 m² at the base of the tower.

With 800 employees, Deutsche Funkturm plays a major role in the expansion of the radio infrastructure in Germany. Its portfolio includes 31.200 radio sites, including 550 towers.
